Historic Function Remarks: Philip Schuyler sold the property to William Murphy in 1861 for \$1. William and Sophia Murphy sold to August Wehrli for \$350 in 1868. This increase in price may indicate improvements on the lot.

Physical Description/Remarks: L-shaped dwelling two stories tall and three bays wide. Front portion is side-gabled with decorative front gable and second-story porch. One-story shed in rear southeast juncture. Attached frame garage on east side. Stone walls and foundation, asphalt shingle roof. East garage and rear southeast shed are frame construction. West brick chimney. Window sills, massive lintels and front quoins are dressed stone. Windows are 4/4 double-hungs.

General Remarks: Schuyler received three patents for land in Burlingame, one for himself and two on behalf of the town of Burlingame. The earliest was for the E/2 of the SW/4 of Section 11 (which is on the eastern part of the current townsite and includes the river) in June 1860. The patent says, "The said warrant having been assigned by the said Benjamin Million to Philip C. Schuyler in whose farm (?) said tract has been located." In March 1862, Mayor Schuyler, acting on behalf of the town, received two patents: one for the W/2 and the SE/4 of the NW/4 of Section 14 and the NE/4 of Section 15, where this house is located.
